PUBLICATION AND REVIEW POLICY

Law et Justicia Law Review follows a Double-Blind Peer Review Policy.

THEME

Authors are allowed to write on any socio-legal or purely legal issues.

ELIGIBILITY

Students pursuing Bachelor's or Masters in Law, Professors, Academicians, Advocates, Research Scholars, and Law enthusiasts are eligible to send in their entries.

ABSTRACT

Authors are required to mandatorily submit an abstract of not more than 300 words along with their manuscripts excluding the word limit.

WORD LIMIT

- Research Papers: (4000 8000 words including footnotes)
- Articles: (2000 4000 words including footnotes)
- Short Notes: (1000-3000 words including footnotes)
- Book Reviews: (1000-2000 words including footnotes)
- Case Commentaries: (800-2000 words including footnotes)

AUTHORSHIP

Co-authorship of a maximum of two authors is permitted.

COPYRIGHT POLICY

Law et Justicia Law Review shall retain all copyright arising out of any publications. The authors will be duly acknowledged in all publications.

METHOD OF CITATION

Authors are required to follow the 20^{th} Edition Harvard Bluebook style of formatting. Non-Conformity with the same shall be a ground for rejection.

FORMATTING GUIDELINES

- 1. It should be in MS Word format.
- 2. There shall be an appropriate title of the manuscript.
- 3. The manuscript shall be original and unpublished.
- 4. Plagiarism should not exceed 20%.
- 5. The submission shall be grammatically correct, non-plagiarized, and free from any spelling mistakes.
- 6. The full names of all the author(s) must be given in the cover letter.
- 7. The body of the manuscript shall be in Times New Roman, font size 12, 1.5 line spacing and justified.
- 8. Footnotes should be in Times New Roman and size 10, with single line spacing and justified.
- 9. There shall be no Borders.
- 10. There shall be a margin of 1inch on all sides.
